SAVOURING OUR SAVIOUR DISH OF THE DAY 'Feast of Trumpets'

READ: (Leviticus 23:23-25 & 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)

Read (Proverbs 27:2) and discuss WHAT blowing your own trumpet means, then answer the questions below.

Q. HAVE you ever fallen foul of blowing your own trumpet?

- **Q.** WHAT can be the fallout of blowing your own trumpet?
- **Q.** WHO in the Bible do you think illustrates the dangers of blowing your own trumpet by ignoring proverbs advice?

In contrast to blowing one's own trumpet is the blowing of the trumpet to sound the call of God.

- **Q.** From reading (Numbers 10:1-10) HOW many reasons can you find that demanded the trumpet to sound?
- **Q.** WHY do you think God wanted the trumpet to sound for these times?

(Leviticus 23:23-25)

The time gap between Pentecost and the feast of trumpets to Israel allowed for the gathering in of their wheat harvest. **Q.** HOW might (John 4:35) instruct us on what we should

be doing between now and the final trumpet sounding? Ten days after the feast of trumpets was sounded the day of atonement arrived.

- **Q.** HOW might the ten days of trumpets have prepared the people back then for the upcoming day of atonement?
- **Q.** WHAT might we need to do to prepare ourselves in thankfulness for the forgiveness we need from God?

The Feast of Trumpets, along with the other six festivals of the LORD, foreshadowed certain aspects of the ministry of Jesus Christ. The prophets linked the blowing of trumpets to the future Day of Judgment: (Joel 2:1)

- **Q.** HOW do you think (1 Thessalonians 4:13-17) helps us in our understanding of this prophetically promised day?
- **Q.** HOW can we encourage (1Thessalonians 4:18) each other best with these words, as Paul told us we ought?
- **Q.** IF you had a trumpet to sound, WHAT might you in the Lord, be calling the world's attention to right now?
