Introduction

Bible discussion:

- 1. What kinds of trials are "according to God's will" and which are not? (4:19)
- 2. How do you think God responds to our self-inflicted trials?
- 3. What does leading an exemplary life mean for you in your specific circumstances?
- 4. How might trials result in opportunities to defend, witness or speak up for our faith? Give examples.
- 5. How did Peter fail to make a defence and what happened subsequently? (This is recorded in all four gospels, see for example Mark 14:66-72, also John 21:15-19)
- 6. How does his failure both challenge and encourage us?

- 7. How does Jesus' example help us? (3:17-22)
- 8. Optional question: Who are in the "imprisoned spirits" in 3:19? (See 2 Peter 2:4 and Jude v6)
- 9. What is the ultimate motive for living an exemplary life, making a defence and doing good? (4:17)
